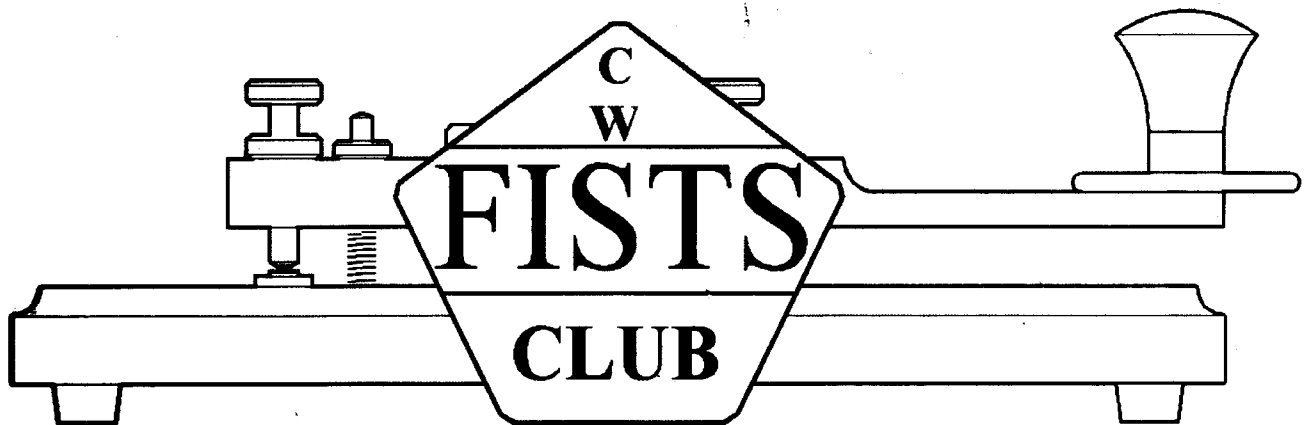

HOW DO I...?

Info on How to Do just about anything related to FISTS

Please read this - it really will answer most of your questions

HOW DO I JOIN?

Membership is open to all people interested in Morse code, irrespective of their speed and ability.

An application form is not necessary to join, but it gives us a more complete picture of our membership. You can download a North American membership application on the FISTS web page: <http://www.fists.org>.

An application can be mailed to you. Send a message Jim Ranieri, AA9LS, aa9ls@turbotoads.com and he will email it to you, or mail an SASE to him at 33778 Rebecca Rd, Kingston IL 60145 and Jim will send you an application via return postal mail.

To join without an application, send your name, call, and mailing address with your membership fee to Nancy WZ8C, PO Box 47, Hadley, MI 48440 (checks payable to FISTS).

To join using Paypal (www.paypal.com), send the funds to fists@tir.com. In the comments box, type NEW MEMBERSHIP, your callsign, name and mailing address if different from your Paypal address. If you join via Paypal, you don't need to send in a paper application.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Subscriptions are **\$15.00/year**; Under 17= **FREE**; College students = **\$10**. Family members may join FISTS at no extra charge-only one newsletter is mailed per household.

Please make checks payable to FISTS CW Club and send to FISTS, P O Box 47, Hadley, MI 48440.

Do not send FISTS correspondence to Nancy WZ8C's callbook address.

Checks can take 6-8 weeks to clear from the day received. Nancy processes them, then takes them to the bookkeeper. The bookkeeper enters them into the "official books", then takes them to the bank. Depending on schedules that month, it can take 6-8 weeks. ***It doesn't take 8 weeks to get your number, it just may take that long for your check to clear.***

HOW DO I JOIN USING MY PAYPAL ACCOUNT?

North American FISTS accepts PAYPAL (<http://www.paypal.com>). Address your PAYPAL payment to **FISTS@TIR.COM** To join via Paypal, type "New Membership" in the Paypal Comments Box, your name (if different from the name on your Paypal account), callsign, and mailing address. You don't have to send in a paper application if you join using Paypal.

HOW DO I KNOW WHEN TO RENEW?

We send out renewal postcards, but if you renew prior to your renewal month it will save postage and printing costs as well as volunteer time. Your renewal date is on your Keynote mailing label in the form of year, month, date. For example 2005/4/4 would be a renewal date April 2005. The date of the month is meaningless, but the computer program requires a date, so generally the date of the month is the same as the month. 2005/12/12; 2006/5/5 etc.

HOW DO I RENEW?

To renew, send \$15 (or \$10 if a student) to Nancy WZ8C (checks payable to FISTS) at FISTS, PO Box 47 Hadley MI 48440. If you are under 18 or over 79, there is no renewal fee, but let us know you're still interested so we can renew your subscription.

WHAT IF I AM A MEMBER UNDER 18 or OVER 79?

Renewals are free for a teen (17-) or old-timer membership (80+), but you must notify WZ8C of your continued interest in FISTS, renewals are not automatic.

HOW DO I RENEW WITH PAYPAL? If you have a Paypal account, send the funds to fists@tir.com; put "RENEWAL" in the Comment Box, along with your callsign.

MAY I RENEW FOR MORE THAN ONE YEAR AT A TIME?

Yes! You may renew for as many years at a time as you like, but there is not a 'quantity' discount.

MY MEMBERSHIP LAPSED, CAN I GET MY OLD NUMBER BACK?

Yes - lapsed numbers are put on 'hold' - they aren't reassigned to new members. If you have had a number in the past, please let Nancy know at the time of your renewal so she can 'reactivate' it. Your newsletter will start up with the next issue.

WHY AREN'T ALL FISTS NUMBERS LISTED ON THE WEB PAGE?

Being listed on the Active Members List is a privilege of being a member in good standing. We don't list people whose subs have expired because we assume they are no longer interested in FISTS since they didn't keep up their membership. Some people aren't listed because they choose to remain anonymous to avoid being pounced on by number hunters.

HOW DO I GET A NUMBER FOR MY LOCAL CLUB? Clubs with FCC call signs may be assigned a FISTS number at no charge providing there is at least one FISTS member in good standing in the local club. These clubs are not legally affiliated with FISTS, nor does FISTS have anything to do with how the club is run, etc. It just means the club has a FISTS number and is worth three points toward awards. If the club wants a newsletter, there is a \$15 a year charge. To defray cost, please enclose \$1 when a club applies for an award and \$3 if it wants an award certificate.

HOW DO I UPDATE MY ADDRESS or CALL SIGN ON THE FISTS DATABASE?

Send corrections or changes to Nancy Kott, WZ8C, at FISTS, P. O. Box 47, Hadley, MI 48440 or email to nancy@tir.com. Please send labels with your corrections to the FISTS QSL Bureau so the bureau workers don't have to change all your SASEs by hand.

HOW DO I GET AN UP-TO-DATE MEMBER LIST? Two lists are available on the FISTS Web page. One is a search engine, the other is a text list. You can search the text list by using the "find" function of your browser. The search engine is updated more frequently than the text list on the web page, which is updated monthly. Being listed as an active member is one of the perks of keeping your dues current. If you don't pay your subs, we assume you do not want to be associated with FISTS and will remove your callsign from the membership roster.

HOW DO I GET ON THE FISTS EMAIL LIST? To receive periodic official Email updates, send your Email address, call sign and FISTS number to Kathi Hilton. fistelist@comcast.net. If you put your email address on your application, it is automatically added to the list.

WHY AREN'T EMAIL ADDRESSES AVAILABLE?

It's a privacy issue. When someone gives their email or phone number to FISTS it is treated as confidential information and is only used by FISTS volunteers. Due to potential spam problems, the list is NOT given out to the membership and is NOT published on the web page. It is ONLY used to notify you of FISTS items of interest. *If you want people to know your e-mail address, we recommend you include it in your listing on QRZ.com or Buckmaster lookup service.*

WHAT IS KN0WCW AND HOW DO I OPERATE KN0WCW?

KN0WCW is the USA FISTS Callsign. Members in good standing (meaning, paid up dues) can operate KN0WCW from their home station after getting PERMISSION. To get permission, contact Karl Zuege, KB1DSB (kb1dsb@sover.net). A schedule of operators can be found on the FISTS Web page. Remember, when you're using KN0WCW, you're flying the flag for FISTS, so please operate responsibly.

FISTS AWARDS
General Information

All FISTS awards can be applied for via e-mail.

Send an e-mail to the Awards Manager with your call sign, name and address, FISTS membership number, and the name of the award you are applying for. Attach your log of all contacts for the award to the e-mail. The **ONLY** files that can be accepted are; Excel, Word, and Text files.

DO NOT send logs that are scanned images of your log pasted into Excel and Word documents. Scanned images of log pages will not be accepted.

The **ONLY** data on the log should be Call, Date, Band, FISTS Nr, Points, CC number.

=====**IMPORTANT** (For logs submitted via e-mail): Use a **SINGLE TAB** between data elements. **NO SPACES**. The information on your attached log is exported into Excel and checked for duplicate contacts. The data cannot be exported properly if there are spaces instead of **ONE TAB**. Each data element must be in a field of its own. Which means, **DO NOT** include any other information such as "QTH", "Name", or the letters "FISTS #", or "CC" in with any of the data.

Logs that DO NOT follow this format will be returned unprocessed.

We realize that the data will not line up in neat even columns when using a single TAB. It doesn't matter if the data on the log lines up or not because it is checked using a computer program, not by printing it out and looking at it. It just takes too much time to convert the logs with spaces in them to a log with a single TAB, so they will not be accepted.

=====**Carefully check your log for duplicate contacts and delete them prior to sending your log for an award. Deleting Dupes from your log is your responsibility. Paper and electronic logs with excessive Dupes will be returned and not processed.**

Please do not send logs that are scanned images (.jpg .gif for example) of your log pasted into Excel and Word documents. Scanned images of log pages will not be accepted. All logs must have "editable" text.

When you apply for an award, please send the complete log for that award. For example, if you have the Silver award and are applying for the Gold award, send the complete log showing all contacts used for the Gold award 500 points.

If you are mailing your award application, **DO NOT SEND YOUR ORIGINAL LOG**: send a copy. After the logs are checked the logs are discarded, as it is too expensive to mail them back. If you want your log returned, include sufficient return postage.

All contacts submitted in award logs must have been made via two-way CW mode on the air using the call sign, or a previous call sign held by the person submitting the award log.

There is no charge for awards of FISTS members whose dues are current. Non-FISTS and FISTS members whose dues are not current are eligible for awards, but must enclose \$3 to help defray expenses.

Dupe Check Sheets

A "Duplicate" Check Sheet must be included with all submitted paper logs of over 100 contacts that are not sorted by FISTS number for Century Awards, or sorted by CC number for Platinum Awards. If your log is sorted by FISTS number or CC number, you do not need to send a Dupe Sheet.

NOTE: The NANFA Award does not require a Dupe Sheet.

A "Dupe" check sheet can be downloaded from the FISTS web page. To view it online, just click the link. To download, "right mouse click" on the link and "save as" to your hard drive.

To make your own Dupe Sheet, take a blank sheet of 8.5 by 11 paper and turn it sideways so that the long side is at the top. Write the numbers 1 through 9 along the top edge of the paper spreading them out so you have plenty of room between each number. Now, go through your award log and write the FISTS number for each QSO under the numbered column that corresponds with the first number of each FISTS number. **DO NOT USE THE CALL SIGNS.** Each time you enter a new number in a column, check down through that column to see if that FISTS number has been previously entered. If it has, then it is a dupe and should **NOT** be used for your Award Log. This "Dupe" sheet needs to be sent with your award log when applying for awards with over 100 contacts.

What is a CC Number?

This is one of the most asked FISTS Questions! CC stands for Century Certificate. A CC number is the number on the certificate you get when you earn the Basic Century Award. Each certificate has a sequentially issued number on it. That number is your CC number. People exchange CC numbers on the air because the Platinum awards are earned by "collecting" them. You need not have a CC number to collect CC numbers, but it makes it more fun if you can give one out, too. Please make sure the CC number you have in your log is actually a FISTS CC number. Other groups now use CC numbers and their numbers do not count toward FISTS awards.

The Century Award Series

IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER: A FISTS number can only be counted once.

YOU don't have to be a FISTS member at the time of the contact, but **THE PERSON you are claiming for Century Award points must have a FISTS number AT THE TIME OF THE CONTACT.** For **example**, if you QSO with someone who is not a FISTS member, but they join FISTS after the QSO, you **must work them again** for credit. You cannot count the QSO you had before they joined FISTS toward the Century Award.

The person you contact does not have to be an Active Member at the time of your contact. Their number still counts. It would be impossible for our Awards Manager to cross-check dates of renewals to the contact dates, so we make it simple and say "everyone counts". We would hope that if someone cares enough to give out their FISTS number on the air, they will care enough to support the club, but their number counts **regardless** whether they are a member in good standing or not.

A QSL card is not needed to claim the contact for Century Awards. A worksheet is available on the FISTS Web page in PDF format (you need the FREE Adobe Reader to view/use it). Use it to help keep track of stations worked, and it can be used for ALL of the Century Awards.

Basic Century Award

The Century Award is earned by working 100 points of FISTS members. FISTS operating from the same country that you are in are worth one point. FISTS operating from a different country, as defined by DXCC rules, are worth two points. FISTS affiliated club stations are worth three points.

The following FISTS National Club Stations are worth 5 points towards FISTS Century Class awards;

GXØIPX #0001, ZL6FF #9600, VK2FDU #9610, JL3YMV, #15,000 and KNØWCW #10,000

Silver Century Award

The Silver Century Award has the same rules as the Basic Century and is for a total of 250 points. Points used to claim the Basic Century may be used toward the Silver Century Award. Send a log showing all 250 points used for the Silver Award.

Gold Century Award

The Gold Century Award has the same rules as the Basic Century, but it is for a total of 500 points. Points used to claim the Basic Century & Silver Century may be used toward the Gold Century Award. Send a log showing all 500 points used for the Gold Award.

Diamond Century Award

The Diamond Century Award has the same rules as the Basic Century, but it is for a total of 1000 points. Points used to claim the Basic, Silver, and Gold Centurys may be used toward the Diamond Century. Send a log showing all 1000 points used for the Diamond Award.

NOTE — If you earn your Basic, Silver, Gold, or Diamond award using QRP, (5 watts or less), please state so at the time of your application for that award. Your call will be printed on the award as, “ Your Call - QRP “.

The Platinum Award Series

Basic Platinum

This award, which used to be called the Century of the Centuries, is earned by working 100 different Century Certificate holders. The Century Certificate (CC) number must be obtained during an on-air CW QSO. Each CC number is only counted once, for a total of 100 numbers, regardless of location or band.

You do not have to have a QSL card to claim the contact for the Platinum Awards. A worksheet is available on the FISTS Web page in PDF format (you need the FREE Adobe Reader to view/use it). Use it as a check sheet to help keep track of stations worked, and it can be used for ALL of the Platinum Awards.

Platinum 250 Award

The 250 Platinum Award is for 250 Century Award holder Contacts. Send a log showing all 250 CC numbers used for the Platinum 250 Award.

Platinum 500 Award

The 500 Platinum Award is for 500 Century Award holder Contacts. Send a log showing all 500 CC numbers used for the Platinum 500 Award.

Mobile Award

This award is earned by accumulating 100 points of two-way CW OSO's made while MOBILE on or after September 1, 1998.

Point rules are the same as the Basic Century Certificate Award. Duplicate contacts do not count.

For purposes of this award “MOBILE” means: Any land motor vehicle used to transport people (car, truck, etc.) Transmitting and receiving antennas must be physically attached to the vehicle.

Transceiver must be located inside the vehicle and powered by the vehicle's electrical system.

You may count the points claimed for the Mobile Award toward the one and two-way QRP Awards if the power is 5 watts or less. They may also be counted toward the Gold, Platinum, or other awards if you have not previously claimed these contacts.

Worked All States Award

The WORKED ALL STATES award is earned by working FISTS members in all 50 states. The station worked must be a FISTS member at the time of the contact.

Contacts must be made from the same location, or from locations no two of which are more than 50 miles apart which is affirmed by signature of the applicant on the application.

A checksheet is available in PDF format on the FISTS Web page.

Rag Chewers Award

This award is earned by making 100 two-way CW QSO's, each lasting at least 30 minutes, with another FISTS member on or after the date of September 1, 1998. Duplicate member contacts are valid, but they must be made on different dates.

1 X QRP Award

The 1 X QRP Award is earned by working 100 points of FISTS members while you are operating QRP, 5 watts or less. Same point rules as the Basic Century Award.

2 X QRP Award

The 2 X QRP Award is earned by working 100 points of FISTS members while you and the other station contacted are both operating QRP, 5 watts or less. Same point rules as the Basic Century Award.

Nightmare Alpha-Numeric FISTS Award (NANFA)

Start date for this award is January 1, 2003. THERE IS NO ENDING DATE - Take as long as you want to finish it! All contacts claimed for this award must be made after the starting date.

This award will be a lot of fun as well as a challenge. The award was created by Jack Bock, K7ZR #2656. (Silent Key)

REPEAT: There is NO TIME LIMIT to complete this award.

- 1) Contacts must be 2-way CW on-air contacts made on and after Jan 1, 2003.
- 2) Contacts can be made at any time, any place at any speed.
- 3) Contacts must be with a person or club with a FISTS number.
- 4) Contacts can be with FISTS from any country.

The object is to work stations whose call signs fit into the squares on a grid. There are 260 squares (26 letters and 10 numerals) 'Counters' are the last numeral of the call sign and the first letter of the suffix. For example, K7ZR goes in the 7 column at the Z row. WZ8C fits in the 8 column on the C row. P31ABC would be in the 1 column on the A row. By convention, use the numeral of a portable designator if there is one - WB9CIS /M3 would be in the 3 column on the C row. Also put the date (month/day) in the square with the call sign for reference.

You can make your own grid sheet by taking a piece of 8.5" x 11" lined writing paper and drawing 10 each 3/4" vertical columns labeling them "1" through "0". Then go to the left-hand margin and label 26 of the horizontal stripes "A" through "Z".

A ready-made .pdf grid log, is available for downloading on the FISTS Web page.

To get your NANFA certificate, send your completed grid (filled in with the call signs and dates) along with your log containing the same contact info used for the Basic Century Award. If you work the award using QRP state so on your award application. Your award certificate will then be printed with "Your Call - QRP".

The Millionaire Award

So, you want to be a millionaire? You'll feel like a million bucks when you hang this piece of wallpaper in your shack! This award is simple and obtainable, as well as challenging. You earn it by working a total of a million in FISTS membership numbers. The basic award is for one million points with endorsement stickers for additional increments of one million.

For example, if you work member number 11500 and member number 10000 and then work #379, you'd have a total of 21,879 points.

We hope to encourage newer FISTS members to get on the air, since they have "bigger" FISTS membership numbers they will be sought after.

You may only claim member numbers for credit once per band, but use as many bands as you want. If you use the WARC's please be sure your contact is a legit QSO. We don't want FISTS to have the reputation of being the ones to spoil the WARC's with hit and run, contest like QSO's. Exchange FISTS numbers on the air and have a little chat - about the weather, your key, your rig, family...

Two-way CW contacts only. You do not need to get a QSL confirmation of the QSO - just keep a running total of the FISTS membership number points. Only contacts made on or after January 1, 2006 are valid.

To claim the award with a paper/written log, include a log sheet that has the contacted callsign, band & date worked and FISTS number - with the numbers totaled - and DUPE sheets for each of the bands used. Since you may work a FISTS number on different bands for credit, separate dupe sheets for each band are necessary to help the Awards Manager verify your log.

Logs submitted electronically do not need to include dupe sheets. Email logs to Dennis via the link on the bottom of the main FISTS page. Attach your log of all contacts for the award to the e-mail. The ONLY files that can be accepted are; Excel, Word, and Text files. Put FISTS in the title of your email

For ALL award submissions, Include your call sign, name and address, FISTS membership number, and the name of the award you are applying for. DO NOT send logs that are scanned images of your log pasted into Excel and Word documents. Scanned images of log pages will not be accepted.

This award is available to FISTS and non-FISTS members. It is free of charge to members in good standing.

Please answer someone's CQ at the speed they are sending and USE SPACES between your letters and words. The most common, yet most easily remedied, problem is SPACING. You can be sending perfectly formed code, but if it's all run together, it still sounds like gibberish and gives you a bad fist.

2007 20-20 Anniversary Award

To celebrate FISTS 20th anniversary in 2007, the 20-20 award will be available for contacts made between individual FISTS members during the period of January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007.

During each calendar month, starting the first of the month and ending the last day of that same month (according to your local time zone) 20 contacts must be made with 20 different FISTS members, each QSO lasting at least 20 minutes.

A certificate with spaces for 12 endorsement stickers will be issued after approval of the first month's completed log, with an endorsement sticker issued for each month's approved log after that. Each month is considered to be a separate endorsement. If you skip a month or several months, you can still apply for months in which you meet the requirements.

A plaque will be awarded to those successfully obtaining an endorsement sticker for each month during 2007 (12 months total).

Rules:

Contacts must include exchange of Callsign, QTH, signal report and FISTS number (for verification purposes).

The "QSO" starts when two-way contact is established. Calling CQ does not count toward QSO time. For example, if you call CQ for ten minutes before you get a reply, that ten minutes does not count toward the 20 minute total. You need to chat for 20 minutes after you establish contact with someone.

Two-way Morse code mode only.

It is open to all power levels, fixed or mobile stations and all legal bands. No endorsements for special-interest operating or bands. Multiple endorsement stickers for more than 20 contacts per month are not available.

Contacts must be made with 20 different individual FISTS members during the calendar month. For the purpose of this award, an "individual FISTS member" is a person. Club calls are not eligible for this award.

However, if you make a contact with a club that has a FISTS number (operated by a FISTS member) and you exchange QSO information with the operator while s/he uses their personal callsign and you chat for a minimum of 20 minutes, you may count the contact with the operator's personal callsign toward the 20-20 Award.

Each month starts a new contact log. You may work the same person in more than one month, but only once per month.

Each Monthly Entry List for the 20-20 Award must contain ONLY the following information: Call Worked, Date, Band, FISTS Nr., QSO Start Time, QSO Stop Time. On the bottom of the list, write your name, callsign, address and the month for which the contacts are being claimed.

There is no charge to FISTS members in good standing for the original certificate, but an SASE or address label for each endorsement sticker is appreciated to ease the workload of the awards manager.

The Award is available to all licensed amateurs. Non-FISTS or FISTS who are delinquent with their subs please include \$3 for the basic certificate and \$1 for endorsement stickers. If a plaque is earned and desired by a non-dues paying Amateur, they will be responsible for the cost of their plaque and shipping.

FISTS USA Club Call Certificates

There are two FISTS USA Club Call certificates: Operator — & — Achievement

FISTS USA Club Call (KN0WCW) Operator Certificate

The Operator Certificate will be issued for making a minimum of 10 contacts per day, (FISTS or non-FISTS stations), of scheduled use of the FISTS USA Club Call during the time you are the Control Operator of the call.

Example: If you signed up to use the Club Call for 5 days total, you must make a minimum total of 50 QSO's with the Club Call in order to qualify for the "Operator Certificate". These 50 contacts may be spread out over the 5 days in any manner.

Log should be in Excel, Word or Text file format. Operator certificates will not be sent out until logs are received and verified.

FISTS USA Club Call (KN0WCW) Achievement Certificate

There are two ways to obtain the Achievement Certificate:

1. Contact the FISTS USA Club Call once each month of the calendar year. (Total of 12 QSO's)

Example: You work W2YMX using the Club Call in January, you may also work W2YMX using the Club Call again in February, plus other stations in the remaining 10 months. A contact needs to be made with the Club Call every month of the year under option #1.

Using Option #1, the same station using the Club Call may be worked more than once providing it is in different months.

OR ...

2. Contact 12 different authorized stations using the FISTS USA Club Call during a calendar year. (Total of 12 QSO's)

Example: If work W2YMX, N1PT and KB1DSB using the Club Call in January, you may not work those stations using the Club Call again in any other month during the year if you are going to claim the Achievement Certificate under option #2.

Using Option #2, you can only work a station authorized to use the Club Call once during the calendar year.

Only Excel, Microsoft Word and Text files are acceptable e-mail logs for the Achievement Award.

Rules for FISTS USA Club Call Use

You must have permission to operate with KN0WCW.

To get permission, contact Karl KB1DSB at kb1dsb@sover.net

Check the FISTS web page for available dates.

1. When using the FISTS USA Club Call (KNØWCW) you must attach YOUR call area to the call depending on where you are located during your operation. Example: KNØWCW/6 if you are located in CA, or KNØWCW/1 if you are located in VT.

2. A log must be kept of all QSO's with the following minimum log information; UTC Date and Time of QSO, Call of Station Worked, Frequency, His RST, Your RST, Name of Operator Worked, and QTH of Station Worked. A Club Call Log sheet is available on the FISTS web page.

3. All assigned dates of operation are according to UTC (GMT) date and time.

4. All contacts made using the FISTS USA Club Call are not useable for awards for your own call sign.

5. KN0WCW attempts to QSL 100%. QSL cards will be provided to you for the times you use the callsign. If you can't fill out and/or send the cards yourself, please let QSL manager Karl know and he will do it for you.

6. All QSO's must be made on CW mode only. Any amateur band may be used.

7. When you are the control operator of the station using the FISTS USA Club Call, you must stay within the operating privileges of your own license class.

8. The FISTS number for the FISTS USA Club Call is 10,000 and is the number you should give out when using the Club Call Sign, NOT your own FISTS number. The FISTS USA Club Call CC number is 1380.

9. Envelopes are being kept on file with the FISTS Bureau and the ARRL 0 Bureau for incoming QSL cards. Incoming cards are being put into albums by Karl, and the albums will be available to take to major hamfests or FISTS activities.

If you want a card from a contact you made while using KN0WCW, that is fine, but please ask the person sending the card to send the card directly to you. Cards sent to the bureau will be sent to Karl for use in the club collection and are considered to be "property" of KN0WCW.

FISTS SPRINTS

OBJECTIVE: To exchange specified information with as many U.S. or Canadian FISTS members as possible, using Morse Code only, and within the time frame stipulated.

PARTICIPANTS: Any properly licensed amateur radio operator, FISTS member or non-member is invited to take part in the contest. At least one of the two stations in each QSO must be a U.S. or Canadian station.

DATE AND TIME:

The Winter SPRINT will run from 1700 UTC to 2100 UTC on Second Saturday in February.
The Spring SPRINT will run from 1700 UTC to 2100 UTC on Second Saturday in May.
The Summer SPRINT will run from 1700 UTC to 2100 UTC on Second Saturday in July.
The Fall SPRINT will run from 1700 UTC to 2100 UTC on Second Saturday in October.
Please note times are in UTC; daylight savings time is NOT a factor.

BANDS: Operation is limited to the following amateur bands: 3.5, 7, 14, 21, and 28 MHz amateur bands. Work stations only once per band.

ENTRY CLASSES: There are three entry classes:

QRO is over 5 watts output power.

QRP which is limited to 5 watts output power or less.

Club (regardless of power). Entry class **MUST** be shown on logs to be considered for entry in a particular class, or will be assumed QRO.

An entry must be ONE class only, no combination of classes is allowed

EXCHANGE: The following information must be exchanged by both stations to count as a valid contest QSO:

For FISTS members: RST, U.S. state/Canadian province/DXCC country, first name, FISTS number.

For non-FISTS members: RST, U.S. state/Canadian province/DXCC country, first name, Power output.

DX COUNTRY STATUS: U.S. states and Canadian provinces are those states and provinces that are contiguous and found within the North American continent. DX are those entities listed in the current ARRL DXCC publication, other than the above.

SCORING:

Each QSO with a FISTS member: 5 points.

Each QSO with a non-FISTS member: 2 points.

MULTIPLIERS: Each U.S. state or Canadian province counts as one multiplier.

Count each only once, no matter how many times worked.

DX countries count as a multiplier each time worked.

If a DX country is worked several times on different bands, each QSO counts as a multiplier.

LOG SUBMISSIONS: Sending the logs is what counts, and they will be spot checked for accuracy and correct scoring procedures. All log entries must be received 30 days after the Sprint to be considered valid. Logs not sent to the proper address will not be considered for entry.

All logs MUST contain the following information to be considered for entry::
Your name and call sign. Club name if entry is for a club. Your FISTS number if a member. Entry class. Your claimed score. List of claimed multipliers. An entry form is available on the web page..

ELECTRONIC LOGS; We will accept E-logs in standard Cabrillo format or ascii text files. If you're not sure about your format, please contact Dan before the entry deadline. E-logs are sent to W8PIG@yahoo.com ONLY.

The International G3ZQS Memorial Straight Key Contest

The International G3ZQS Memorial Straight Key Contest will be 2300Z September 7 to 2300Z September 9, 2007. Everyone is welcome to participate, but only the logs of those using straight keys for all claimed contacts are eligible for awards.

BANDS:

Operation is limited to 3.5, 7, 14, 21, and 28 MHz amateur bands. No WARC's.
Work stations only once per band.

ENTRY CLASSES:

There are three entry classes:

QRO: QRP: Club: Entry class **MUST** be shown on logs to be considered for entry in a particular class, or will be assumed QRO.

An entry must be ONE class only, no combination of classes is allowed.

CALL: CQ FS (short for fists straight = straight key)

EXCHANGE: RST, U.S. state/Canadian province/DXCC country, first name, FISTS number (or power output for non-FISTS).

MULTIPLIERS:

Each U.S. State and Canadian province counts as 1 multiplier. Count each only once, no matter how many times worked.

Each DXCC entity counts as 1 multiplier. Count each no matter how many times worked.

SCORING:

Each QSO with a FISTS member: 5 points.

Each QSO with a non-FISTS member: 2 points.

Final score is total QSO points times multipliers.

Get Your Feet Wet Weekend

Despite all the controversy about licensing and requirements, there are a lot of new hams who are intrigued with the code after passing their 5WPM.

But, like we all were (or are!), they are intimidated and nervous about getting on the air. They've had bad experiences on Field Day or other contests and QSO's where people won't QRS (slow down), and they are getting frustrated. We don't want that to happen! We want to encourage and nurture these new CW operators. The Novice RoundUp used to be a good forum for this, but the Novice concept is obsolete. Something needs to be implemented that would include all classes of newcomers and give them a friendly place to learn the ropes.

The 2006 Get Your Feet Wet Weekend will be 00:00Z Fri Sep 14 (Thursday local) to 00:00Z Sep 17 (Sunday local).

The focus is on sending slowly and clearly and sending the exchange in order. No memory or programable keyers or code readers are allowed - human-powered transmissions only. Certificates will be sent out to the top three scorers in each category free of charge.

The rules: Operate under one of two categories for the entire event, Newcomer or Experienced. You can be licensed a long time but still be a Newcomer to CW or contesting. You're on the honor system: Choose whichever describes your ability.

No WARC bands. Suggested calling frequencies: 3.610, 7.110, 14.110, 21.110, and 28.110. If you don't hear anyone, go ahead and call. Get your feet wet and jump in with a CQ FC on a clear frequency. YOU are there listening; chances are someone else is listening and waiting to hear a CQ, too

Call CQ FC. The Exchange: Callsign/N (newcomer) or Callsign/E (experienced), RST, Name, QTH, FISTS number or power, last two digits of the year licensed.

Example: WZ8C/E, 599, Nancy, MI, 0379, 88.

Count 2 points for working someone out of your category, 1 point for working someone in your category. Multipliers are number of stations worked that were licensed 2000-2005.

Stations may be worked once per band for points, but their multiplier only counts once.

Contacts must be 2-way human-keyed CW (Iambics are fine - just no computerized or memory keyers).

Logs will be sent to Lee Hallin N7NU 3413 Walton Ln, Eugene OR 97408 or in ADIF format to hallinl@lanecc.edu within 30 days of the end of the event.

Logs and Summary pages can be downloaded on the FISTS web site <http://www.fists.org>. They are in Word and RTF format so they should be compatible with any word processing program, including wordpad. Left mouse click on them to open them, right mouse click to "save as"

Excel spreadsheet available: If you want an Excel spreadsheet that will score GYFWW for you, send an email to Lee at hallinL@lanecc.edu indicating if you will be Newcomer or Experienced (so he can adjust the formulas) and your callsign. Lee will email a spreadsheet to you customized just for your callsign and entry class.

Beginner's Guide to the FISTS QSL Bureau

Basically the QSL Bureau works like this: You pack up all your QSL cards you have for contacts with other FISTS members and send them to us. We sort the cards and put them in the Self Addressed Stamped Envelopes (SASE's) which the members have sent to us. When we get 6 to 7 cards in an SASE with one ounce (37 cents) postage on it we mail them. The mailing address for the Bureau is:

So, to get the cards which are sent via the Bureau for you, you need SASE's on file with us. We suggest a minimum of three SASE's be sent. We require envelopes which are at least 4-1/8" high and much prefer the #10 Business Size envelope (4-1/8" x 9-1/2") which will work for nearly all QSL card sizes.

The smaller Personal Size envelope (3 5/8" x 6 1/2") will not handle the large QSL cards which some member send and these envelopes will no longer be accepted.

Some members send 6" x 9" kraft envelopes which can handle all card sizes. If you can find the 5" x 7" kraft envelopes they are a really nice size for SASE's.

Your SASE should have at least one ounce postage (37 cents as of Jan 2007 - rates are due to rise in May) in the upper right hand corner. Your address goes in the normal address portion of the envelope and put your call in LARGE letters in the upper left hand corner. We will put stamp the lower left hand corner of each of your SASE's:

ENVELOPE _____ OF _____

SASE LEFT _____

This will indicate which envelope is being used and how many are left on hand.

We will include a "Last Envelope in Bureau" note when we have used your last envelope. Also, if the numbers in the bottom left hand corner indicates: for example: "Envelope # 3 of 3" - it will have been your last envelope. When you send in additional cards you can then send in additional SASE's.

Based on the weight of a QSL card the following postal rates apply effective July 1, 2002 per the scales in the Moneta, Virginia Post Office: (note - postage is due to change in May 2007)

Weight	Postage	Cards
1 ounce	37 cents	7
2 ounce	60 cents 1	5
3 ounce	83 cents	23
4 ounce	\$1.06	31

If we get a real bunch of cards for you, we may put them all in the one envelope and add postage as required from our "stamp kitty". If we do this, we appreciate your reimbursing the kitty with your next batch of cards. If you put more than 37 cents postage on your SASE's we will wait until we get the number of cards equivalent to the postage before mailing. If you prefer periodic mailing just let us know.

You can send QSL's for contacts with **all** foreign FISTS members to us and we will forward them to Chuck Spence, M0AVW in England or Nigel Hardy, ZL2TX in New Zealand who handle the distribution of QSL cards for overseas DX. We distribute cards for Canadian FISTS and other DX FISTS in North and South America

directly from the Bureau.

So, send us your QSL cards and some SASE's and you're set up to use the Bureau. However, it won't do any good to send cards for contacts with stations who are not FISTS members as they won't have SASE's on file with us. Also, it is a good idea to confirm with the FISTS member that you will QSL via the Bureau. In that way both will know that there are SASE's at the Bureau.

If you send in a "bunch" of cards it would be appreciated if you sort the U.S cards by call number. It speeds up the initial sort. *But, you don't have to further sort them alphabetically.*

Various members of the Franklin County Amateur Radio Club of Rocky Mount, VA assist me in the work of the QSL Bureau. They do the final sorting and mailing of envelopes.

All costs involved in operating the QSL Bureau come from the **donations** from our members. We mail the DX cards to Chuck in bulk and the cost has averaged 4.5 cents per card. Also we mail the DX cards to Nigel in bulk and the cost has averaged 8.5 cents per card.

So, if you send cards to DX members a donation would be appreciated! Your donation can be cash or checks. If checks, please make them out Stan Reas, to facilitate cashing them.

For Canadian and other non-U.S. members

Since all mail sent out from the Bureau must have U.S. postage stamps, you will have to put U.S. stamps on your SASE's. Since obtaining U.S. stamps may be hard, if not impossible, we suggest that you send SAE's (Self-Addressed-Envelopes) without stamps and some funds to cover the stamps we will obtain for you.

In order to minimize your costs, we will accept mailing labels with your address on them in lieu of SAE's and will paste them on envelopes from our stock. Just include some funds with your labels to cover the stamps.

Such funds can be "Green Stamps" or checks or IRC's. If checks, please make them out to Stan Reas, to aid in ease of cashing the checks.

Based on the weight of a QSL card at the Moneta, Virginia Post Office the following rates would apply:

interesting QSL cards that members themselves print on post card stock. However, the standard stock is 4-1/4" by 5-1/2". And those 4-1/4" high cards will not quite fit in the # 10 business size envelope. If the cards were cut down by the member to 4" high they will fit in a # 10 envelope. It is nuisance for us here at the Bureau to cut the cards and often the member will have written a note which fully utilizes the 4-1/4" height. So those cards we must fold in order to get them into a # 10 envelope. Some DX cards are also larger and will not fit in small envelopes.

If everyone would cut their "home built" cards to the standard QSL size, 3-1/2" x 5-1/2", that would help a lot because then the cards will even fit into those few personal size envelopes we still have on file.

We do appreciate members sending # 10 business size envelopes for their SASE's. The small personal size envelope which is 3-5/8" x 6-1/2" can not accommodate these larger cards. The Bureau staff are all volunteers and they have become frustrated with trying to patch up the small envelopes to mail the larger cards. They are reluctant to fold the large cards.

They have resorted to: Cutting the front off of the small envelopes and taping it to a # 10 envelope. Taping paper to the flap and taping down the increased flap. Peeling stamps from the small envelopes and using Rubber Cement to paste them to a # 10 envelope and then writing the address on the # 10 by hand

The bureau will no longer accept envelopes with height dimension less than 4-1/8" which is that of the # 10 business size envelope. That means we will not accept any personal size (3-5/8" x 6-1/2") envelopes.

We much prefer the Business Size envelope which is 4-1/8" x 9-1/2" but will accept other envelopes which are at least 4-1/8" x 6" - such as the 6" x 9" and the 5" x 7" Kraft envelopes, except Charlie, K4BSF who handles the "8" calls for the Bureau will only accept # 10 Business Size envelopes!

If there are any of you who live so far away from a store selling # 10 Business Size envelopes, we will accept mailing labels with your address on them and stamps and money in lieu of SASE's. We will put your labels and your stamps onto # 10 envelopes which we will furnish from our stock.

It started matching people on an infrequent basis, and has developed into a very popular and highly organized program thanks to Nancy Kott, WZ8C and later by Ed Breneiser, WA3WSJ and John Cmiel, W9EM, webmaster of the Code Buddy site. Nick Yokanovich, K3NY, now oversees the program with the assistance of the Historical Electronics Museum ARC, W3HEM.

You don't have to be a member of FISTS to participate in our Code Buddy Program, but there are a many reasons to join the club. We have thousands of members worldwide and I'm proud to say, we are the fastest growing CW organization in the world. If you are not a member, check out some of the benefits on our web site at www.fists.org. You will find applications for membership to both the FISTS CW Club and our Code Buddy Program on the web site. If you decide to join the club, and I hope you do, you will find it is loaded with friendly, helpful and interesting people.

Now, back to the Code Buddy program. In general terms, the FISTS Code Buddy Program matches an experienced CW operator with someone that wants to improve. They find convenient schedules and work one on one, on the air, to develop good operating skills and improve speed. It has been a very successful program. We have several hundred participants.

The first step in joining is to fill out a Code Buddy Application so we can collect your profile information and put you in our database for an assignment. We'd love to have you join the team either as a student and/or teacher -also known as an Elmer.

Sometimes it takes a little while, but rest assured we are reviewing all of the student and teacher applications every week and will get an assignment for you as soon as possible.

If you can, let us know your best areas of propagation. It gives us some idea of the best place to start when making an assignment. Also, as much personal information that you care to share, hobbies, interests, background, etc., helps us find someone that may be more compatible.

We can also match you up with someone who is around your own speed, who just would like a friendly fist on the other end of the QSO. If you are a nervous beginner with Morse code, Code Buddies are a perfect way to get over those initial jitters. It also will help you to get code practice - looking forward to a sked on the air gives you a lot of incentive.

A BASIC CW OPERATING MANUAL

Compiled by Dan Stegner KB0OBU from FISTS CW Club member tips

You are ready to make that first contact. Your palms may be sweating and your heart rate may be racing. That's ok. We've all been there. The first time I called CQ I was very nervous. I didn't think it was possible for fingers to have a stuttering problem but there I was, stuttering with my fingers. Gradually I relaxed and calmed down. The CQ's flowed from my fingertips with fluidity before sailing skyward. "Hey, this is really fun," I thought to myself. Suddenly, the inevitable happened; somebody actually answered! The anxiety returned. "Now, what do I do?" Here is some help with establishing that first contact.

Answering CQ

Let's suppose you're tuning across the bands and you hear a station calling CQ. The station seems to be sending at a speed you can copy: CQ CQ CQ DE WA3XYZ K

To answer WA3XYZ you just send the following: WA3XYZ DE (your callsign – lets use mine, KC0OBU, for our examples) AR

That's all there is to it. AR is the letters A and R sent with no spaces in between, a procedural signal that means "end of message" or "over." If the band is noisy or you are running low power, you may want to repeat your call sign twice like so: WA3XYZ DE KC0OBU KC0OBU AR

This is a '1x2'. The other station's call sent once, and yours sent twice. This allows the other station double-check to make sure they got your call right.

If WA3XYZ was able to copy you, that station will then come back with something like:

KC0OBU DE WA3XYZ TNX FER CALL UR RST 559 IN...

If WA3XYZ only copied part of your call sign, you may hear one of the following. The station may or may not add DE WA3XYZ depending on the situation:

QRZ?	(Who's calling me?)
? ?	(Who's there?)
KC?	(KC something....didn't get the rest of your call sign.)
OBU?	(Got the suffix, but I missed the prefix)

In this case, just send your call sign again.

Calling CQ

If the band seems to be in good shape, but nobody is calling CQ, you can do the following:

1. Find a frequency that seems to be clear, and listen for a few seconds. Listening is very important.
2. If you don't hear anything, send **QRL?** and listen for a bit more. Make sure you listen slightly up and down from your transmitting frequency as well. **QRL** is a Q signal that means this frequency is in use. When you send **QRL?** you are asking if the frequency is in use. If somebody comes back with C,

YES, or **QRL**, then move to another frequency so you don't interfere. No further response is needed.

3. If you did not hear a response, send **QRL?** again and listen again. Some stations may take a bit to respond.
4. Still nothing? You can assume the frequency is clear. Immediately send your CQ while the frequency is still open.

The 3x2 CQ call seems to work well for most situations. Call CQ three times, and then send your call twice: CQ CQ CQ DE KC00BU KC00BU K

The final K at the end means you're inviting any station to answer you.

After calling CQ, listen, listen, listen. Listen slightly up and down in case the station trying to answer you is slightly off frequency. You can miss a return call if you are not listening carefully. If you hear nothing, send another 3x2 CQ call again, and listen. Repeat until either somebody answers or you want to try in another spot. Pretty easy, huh?

The 10x2x3 CQ call (CQ sent 10 times followed by your call sign twice, sent three times in a row) is seldom productive. Normally when stations hear this, they will keep moving up or down the band, and you will be scratching your head wondering why nobody is answering your CQ: CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ DE KC00BU KC00BU CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ DE KC00BU KC00BU CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ CQ DE KC00BU KC00BU K

The QSO

Basically there are three parts to a QSO: The introduction, the middle, and the conclusion. Almost sounds like a term paper. Let's take a look at each of these parts.

The Introduction

Once a CQ is answered, the stations first exchange three important pieces of information: RST (a signal report), QTH (location), and Name. So let's suppose I am calling CQ and WA3XYZ answers me. I would then send something like this:

WA3XYZ DE KC00BU GM (GA, GE, GN) TNX CALL UR 559 (579,549, etc) 559 IN TRENARY, MI
TRENARY, MI NAME DAN DAN HW? AR WA3XYZ DE KC00BU KN

First I send the other station's call, then DE (which means from) and then my call sign. Then I say good morning (GM), afternoon (GA), evening (GE), or night (GN), whichever is appropriate. Next I say thanks for the call (TNX CALL) and give the RST signal report (UR 559). I then send my QTH or location followed by my name. You can send 'QTH' instead of 'IN'. But don't send 'MY QTH IS' because that would be redundant....sort of like saying 'MY MY LOCATION IS IS'.

'HW?' is short for 'How are you copying me?'. Then I send AR (Over or End of Transmission), WA3XYZ DE KC00BU (so other stations listening will know who we are) and KN which says go ahead to a specific station, which in this example is WA3XYZ.

The other station will then reply back with its information by sending something like the following: KC00BU DE WA3XYZ R GM DAN NICE TO MEET U UR RST 579 579 QTH PITTSBURGH, PA PITTSBURGH, PA NAME PHIL PHIL HW? AR KC00BU DE WA3XYZ KN

The R sent after the initial call signs means that the other station copied EVERYTHING that you sent. Don't

send R and then ask the other station to repeat part of the information that was sent. It's bad form.

If you need the other station to repeat something send 'PSE RPT NAME', or 'RST', or 'QTH', etc. You can also send something like 'NAME?' or 'RST?' in your next transmission, and the other station should understand.

The Middle

Now, you chat back and forth about whatever you want: the weather, sports, your rigs, antennas, etc., using a format like the following: WA3XYZ DE KC0OBU R blah, blah, blah, AR WA3XYZ DE KC0OBU KN

Then the other station has a turn: KC0OBU DE WA3XYZ R blah, blah, blah, AR KC0OBU DE WA3XYZ KN

Technically, you don't have to send both call signs with each transmission. Some stations just send BK (back to you) and the end of a transmission and then legally identify the station every 10 minutes. Other stations will send both calls with each transmission so those listening will know who they are.

The Conclusion

To end the QSO just send something like: WA3XYZ DE KC0OBU R blah, blah, blah, OK PHIL TNX NICE QSO HPE CUL 73 GM SK WA3XYZ DE KC0OBU K

I thank Phil for a nice QSO, say hope to see you later (HPE CUL), send best wishes (73), and good morning (GM). The SK procedure signal means that's all I have. Similar to AR except it is only used in the final transmission from your station. Phil will then send his final transmission: KC0OBU DE WA3XYZ R FB DAN TNX QSO 73 SK KC0OBU DE WA3XYZ CL

The CL means that Phil is going to be closing his station and won't be answering any more calls. Phil could also end his call with a "dit dit". I would respond with a single dit.

Ending a QSO with the dit dit – dit, or the "shave and a haircut...two bits" is a friendly way of acknowledging that the QSO has ended and you enjoyed the chat. It started back before anyone can remember with one Ham sending 'shave and a haircut' – dahdididahdit - and the other station completing it with 'two bits' – dit dit. It has shortened over the decades to stations sending 'dit dit' and 'dit'.

Please don't fall into the habit of pluralizing. There is no need to send "73s". 73 by itself means "best wishes"; it is not proper to send 73s or 'best wisheses'

Another tip to remember is that most Procedural Signs (like QTH) already mean phrases, and are intended to reduce the amount of sending you need to do to make your point. You don't need to use extra words when using prosigns like QTH. QTH PA is sufficient, not MY QTH IS....

A Cheat Sheet

You might find it helpful to use a cheat sheet that you can refer to when your mind suddenly goes blank. So here it is. Just fill in the blanks and replace WA3XYZ with the other station's call sign.

Is this frequency in use?

QRL? (then LISTEN)

Calling CQ

A Final Word about Speed

Accuracy transcends speed. Most operators would rather copy slower accurate code with proper spacing than code sent fast with uneven spacing and lots of mistakes. Speed will come with practice.

Rule of thumb for spacing: The space between letters should be about as long as a dash – which is equal to 3 dits. The space between words should be about as long as two dashes (technically, 7 dits, but it's easier to estimate 'two dashes' since you DON'T want to start counting). Keep in mind that the person on the other end has to decipher your sending, so make it as clear for them as you can. Spacing is just as important as the letters themselves. Without spacing, it's all gibberish! Space between your letters, and pause ever so slightly between words.

It is asking for trouble to call CQ with a speed faster than you can comfortably copy, because that will probably be the speed somebody will use when answering you. Don't get frustrated if the other station doesn't slow down for you, even after you have sent PSE QRS (please send slower). The other station may be pressed for time, in the heat battle during a contest, or has been operating at a fast speed for so long that they have difficulty copying or sending slower. You also need to be courteous. Do not assume that everyone who does not slow down is being a jerk. If you cannot copy the other station, just say SRI TOO FAST, send them a 73 and move on. You are sure to find somebody that you can work.
