Continuing discussion on A Breath of Bad Air

Response fm the author of the article in Oct Keynote

I was dismayed by Patti AF9H's letter regarding my article on poor sending in the October Keynote. At first I was concerned that I had poorly conveyed my point of view, but Geo's comment and the suggestion from Trevor G4IXI that the article "should be publicised more widely in the journals" went a long way toward restoring my self-confidence!

I'm sorry Patti was upset, but I believe that she read something into my comments that was absolutely not intended.

The article was focused (I thought) very specifically on individuals who are sending poorly formed or spaced characters but are unaware that there is a problem. There was no intention to criticize those who are physically impaired, and no intention to imply that we should all be capable of sending perfect code. But there is an increasing amount of very sloppy Morse on the bands, some of which simply cannot be copied even by a skilled operator. It's largely due to three factors:

There is a tendency (however caused) to try to send faster than one is really able. The answer to this is simply to slow down.

There is also a problem with "bugs" or semi-automatic keying devices. Tune across any HF band on any evening and you will hear "bad" Morse from improperly adjusted or improperly used bugs.

A third problem is directly related to the fact that a sending test is no longer required in this country. People pass a 13 or 20 wpm receiving test and believe they are competent CW operators. It's not entirely their fault — until they get on air nobody has ever heard them send!

All of these problems can be resolved—but only if

the operator knows that there IS a problem! Hence the article and the proposition that we should not hesitate to politely suggest that some sort of adjustment is in order.

Patti suggests that patience will solve the problem. Patience is certainly required, and I would hope it is a standard trait of any CW operator; certainly of any FISTS member. But patience won't SOLVE the problem— it just helps you to hang in there until there is some sort of resolution. As my own Elmer would have said, "You can't learn anything until you know what you don't know!"

CW on 10 Meters or the lack thereof...

Greetings FISTS from sunny Southern Illinois. This is my first FISTS article, so pls bear wid me.

We have a problem folks, and I need all of you to aid me in its solution. The problem here seems to be that our friends on eleven meters seem to believe that the bottom 325 khz or so of ten are just additional CB channels they can retreat to when they feel the need. Obviously this is not a new problem, as both the Mexican and American CBer's have been doing this for at least 10 years that I know of. However, I believe that it's time we start doing something about it, and this is where all you good folks come in.

I have been trying, with moderate success, to run these folks off by qrming wid my CW keyboard. But I can't be in every part of the CW band at the same time, nor can I hear all CBer's that are infringing on our territory. This is where you come in.

The only time I find any good activity on the band is during contest weekends, and only then if the band is in decent enough shape. It's my goal to change that. My main approach to this is by trying to get the local folks on 10 CW, thereby keeping at least a little activity going while the band is asleep. It is my hope that many of you will follow my example in this. Then, at least, you won't have to worry about 40 M QRM or 80 M QRM. Besides, ten meter rigs are cheap and antenna size isn't overly cumbersome.

I was recently having a SSB QSO on ten wid a local boy when the band was seemingly dead. All at once, a KC4 jumped in es told us that we were running 10-20 dB over S9 in southern Fla. So wid that, who knowswe may just run into each other!

So my point? Get on 10 CW and use it! It's the ideal place to tutor folks working on CW upgrades, and Lord knows that the band could use the workout! FISTS can't recommend intentional QRMing, but making use of the bands with legit QSO's is a terrific idea. Many "write off" 10 meters as dead, when as Jim points out, anything is possible, specially propagation surprises!

Interesting Talk by Professional CW Operator

Our radio club tonight had as guest speaker Rod Deakin, ham and professional CW operator for the Globe Wireless station KFS in Half Moon Bay.

First, CW is emphatically not dead. The Coast Guard has phased it out, and U.S. ships don't use it, but there are about 150,000 ships around the world and most of them still use CW. U.S. ships are about 11% of them, so maybe 89% of the ships in the world use CW. KFS has the receiver site in Half Moon Bay, the transmitter site in Palo Alto, and also operates by remote control a transmitter and receiver site in Slidell, LA.

A competing company has sites in Bolinas and Point Reyes CA, and there is a third company up in Washington. There are perhaps 50 shore-based CW operators with these stations on the West Coast and somewhat more on the East Coast. Marine CW may not go on forever, but the end is not in sight.

Equipment: They have transmitters by Press Wireless that date back to WW-II. They have more modem transmitters using Henry amplifiers; and they are about to replace those amplifiers with other Henry amplifiers designed especially for their kind of service. Transmitters these days run 5KW. They used to use 10 KW but modern receivers are better than the old ones and allow lower transmit power. For receivers they use Kenwood R-5000s in scanning mode and some old Watkins-Johnson models for copying traffic. They are getting some new receivers made by TCI and some by none other than Ten-Tec. The new receivers are entirely ASCII controlled, have no front panel controls at all. They use ASCII control with the present receivers from Half Moon Bay to the Slidell site, which is operated entirely by remote control. T-1 lines connect Half Moon Bay with Palo Alto and Slidell. I didn't catch what kinds of exciters are used with the Henry amplifiers; might have been Harris. He uses a bug or a paddle driven keyer; no keyboard-generated CW. The received copy is typed on a computer keyboard. The monitor has a split screen, part for the message and part for the billing information. When they receive a message from a ship they transmit it to its ultimate destination by email, Telex, voice, fax or in some cases telegraph cable. For antennas they have log-periodics & something like discones. There's no point-to-point HF anymore so the big rhombics are

In addition to CW they use SITOR and Clover. Clover uses the same modem board HAL sells to hams, but with very different firmware, intentionally incompatible with the ham version of Clover. They like Clover because of its speed and its ability to transmit binary files. These days there is a need to transmit software binary files to ships at sea. Big modern ships use INMARSAT; but there are many ships that still have HF radio as their only link to the rest of the world.

A description of the operation is rather complicated. There are bands of frequencies: 500KHz and then a band in the 4MHz region, one in 6MHz, one in 8MHz, and more. For each of these bands there is a primary and an alternate frequency; and there are these pairs of frequencies for five different regions of the world and a pair for worldwide. A ship calls on one of these frequencies. The shore station transmits on one of its frequencies in the same band, and tunes the receiver to a frequency in the same band told to them by the ship. The shore station transmitters are fixed frequency; the ship transmitters move off the calling frequency to handle traffic. The scanning receivers scan the calling frequencies, usually 500 KHz, the pair of frequencies for the local area of the world, and the worldwide pair of frequencies. Because of the remote site the operator is scanning that set of frequencies locally and also scanning the appropriate set of frequencies for Slidell. Operators can set things up any way they like; his preference is for Slidell in one ear and Half Moon Bay in the other. On CW ships use call signs rather than their names. The operators typically don't know much English; but many of the messages are of a fill-in-the-blanks nature, and then with Q signals and other universally understood signals they get by.

On a 4-hour watch he will handle typically 50 messages from ships. Some of these are position reports. Ships are required to report their positions and intentions every 48 hours. This information is passed to the Coast Guard free of charge. Ships also report weather every 24 hours and this is passed to NOAA free of charge. Other messages are mostly of a business nature and are charged for. Rates depend on the distance to the destination but might be 50 cents a word. All the rates are actually in gold francs, as an international currency. These business messages are typically to the ship's owners and report position, fuel on board, things needing repair at the next port, supplies needed, expected arrival times, and that sort of thing.

Another kind of activity is for medical problems on board; they communicate with a doctor on shore and get instructions for treating the sick or injured. Very few ships carry doctors, and only those with larger crews carry a nurse. Crew members have at least first aid and CPR training. Then there are all the weird kinds of things that can happen on ships; he gave an example of a crew member who killed another. They locked up the killer, put the corpse into a refrigerated container, and asked the ship's owners whether to bury the body at sea, head for the nearest port, or com

plete the voyage and deal with the problem then.

Bringing a ship into port is about as involved as landing an airplane, except everything is much slower. In SF Bay the ship has to take on a pilot who is an expert at getting to the dock without running aground If the ship arrives too early or too late it will miss its time slot for a berth and have to wait, just like an airliner having to wait for a gate. He told of one tanker ship that needed deeper water than SF Bay has even at high tide; so it had to anchor and off-load the cargo into barges. Lots of messages flew around as they dealt with that problem.

CW operation is typically at 18-25 WPM. The shore operators are typically very skilled; they love operating CW and got good at it because they wanted to. Many of the ship operators and awful. They operate CW only because they get paid for doing it and don't care about being good at it. He played a tape, just for laughs, of a particularly lousy ship operator.

Then Rod got to his hobby, which is the restored Liberty ship Jeremiah O'Brien based in San Francisco at Pier 32. Right now you can't go on the ship -even the volunteer workers can't go on the ship - because of the government shutdown. But in normal times it is open 7 days a week. The radio room is furnished with authentic gear of the period. For the \$5 admission you can spend all day on the ship if you wish, and there are docents to answer questions. Every couple of months they have a live steam day when they don't go anywhere but do get up steam and you can see all the machinery operate. They will probably go on a voyage this summer, perhaps to Seattle.

I don't like to reprint from other publications, but thought this was interesting, and not many FISTS have access to this one, so hope you enjoyed it! WZ8C

The call GB2BP is assigned the FISTS number of 1890 so you get an extra bonus when finding it.

During WW2, Bletchley Park was the location of much highly secret work. It was here that the enigma code was finally cracked and countless gadgets used by the allied forces were developed - items such as buttons with tiny compasses incorporated. For visitors to the country, this is a must and now, with the shack installed, it is a nice spot for even holidaying Brits to visit

LISTINGS

The purchase of the new A3 printer means that I have been able to release the original HPIIIP to Bob, G0FRL. Hitherto, his printer did not carry the same integral font (Line Printer) which is used for listings and it was necessary for him to photocopy a master copy which he picked up from me each month. He is now able to offer up-to-date listings. At this end, the new printer besides offering twice the definition of the HPIIIP chums out copies at four times the rate of the old one i.e. 16 ppm.

The same format for listings is offered - CALL v NAME (indexed on suffix), CALL v NUMBER (indexed on number) and CALL v NAME v NUMBER also index on suffix. This latter is set to reach four full A4 pages very shortly and if you are ordering this one then an additional 2nd class stamp (over and above the one which is requested for the first two categories) would be appreciated since separate pages are used (trying to auto feed a reverse copy is a little iffy) and, of course, it doubles the demands on the printer. All categories are complete listings including up-to-date US allocations.

OBSERVATIONS

Even the most hardened and critical of veterans must confess that these days, the standard of code from beginners and novices has improved enormously. Indeed, procedure has likewise taken on a refreshing face lift. Have our grouses about extended CQ calls been heard - certainly they seem to be getting fewer and much of this I like to think is to be credited to

There have been a number of occasions when a weak. possibly DX response has been overwhelmed by someone who perhaps knows me well launching into a full blown over and scaring the weaker station off without giving me the chance to say QRX pse - YL1?? 339 BK. Another, pedanticism aside, is erasures following a simple and obvious error. Most ops will be forgiving of ANT DEPOLE accepting dipole as default.

Happily, most of my German friends tolerate my fractured Deutsch and rarely offer corrections but I have heard "G" stations who should have been on the bands long enough to know better, trying to explain the niceties of grammar to someone who has gone out of his way to attempt a QSO in what must be to them a very complex English language.
