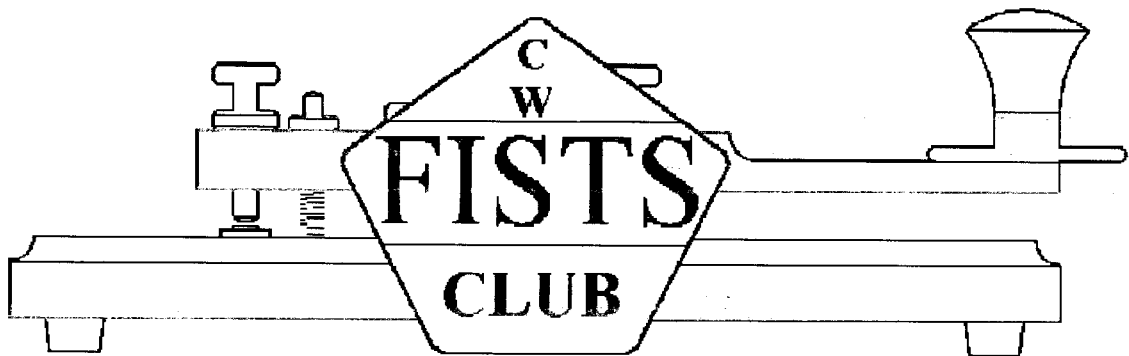

At the end of nearly every QSO you'll hear an exchange of "dit dit". Did you ever think about what that means? 1. "Dit dit" is more than a simple sign-off or the completion of the old "Shave and a haircut..."

3. During a contest, if you tell the station that just called you that they are a dupe, their reply is usually a simple "dit dit" meaning, "Sorry – good luck!"

6. "Dit dit" can mean, "Thanks and 73".
7. "Dit dit" is a private exchange between 2 CW operators who know the lore and history of amateur radio. It's similar to knowing the difference between "73" and "73's" (only one is correct...) or knowing when to use SK or AR.

If you don't get a thrill out of running contacts in a CW contest, making 2 or 3 QSOs per minute, then I hope you reach that point soon. I absolutely LOVE CW, and it's hard for me to explain to non-CW folks like my XYL. She's just happy that I'm doing something I love to do – she's wonderful!

I'd really like to expand this list with your input on what "dit dit" means to you. Please think about it as you tune the bands and then drop me a note with your thoughts. Vy 73, Charlie, K8IJ

20 meter antenna for QRP operation

Years ago I built the Norcal 20 and 40 meter QRP CW transceivers. I seek out opportunities to take a little radio into the field for portable operation. These efforts were dashed last year, when the manager of the hotel where we were staying rejected my plan to attach dipole ends to the building. After that I resolved to use an antenna that would require no attachments to buildings nor trees. This article shares the result.

Fig. 1 shows the base detail for a 20 meter antenna with a quarter wave vertical radiator made

of aluminum tubing. The figure shows base support, mounting hardware, connections, and four radials going out from the base. The base is not critical in size, but it needs to be heavy enough keep the antenna from tipping over easily. Mine is made from old 4"x4" lumber, and measures 19" on a side. It seems to be heavy enough. Radio Shack clamps mount to 1" lumber and support the vertical tubing. The bottom clamp connects the vertical to the center conductor of 52-ohm coaxial cable via an SO-239/PL-259 socket/plug pair. The coaxial shield is in common with an aluminum angle brace, which secures the lumber base shape. The brace also distributes ground current to two banana connectors, each of which serves a pair of radials.

The antenna is simple to build and adjust. I

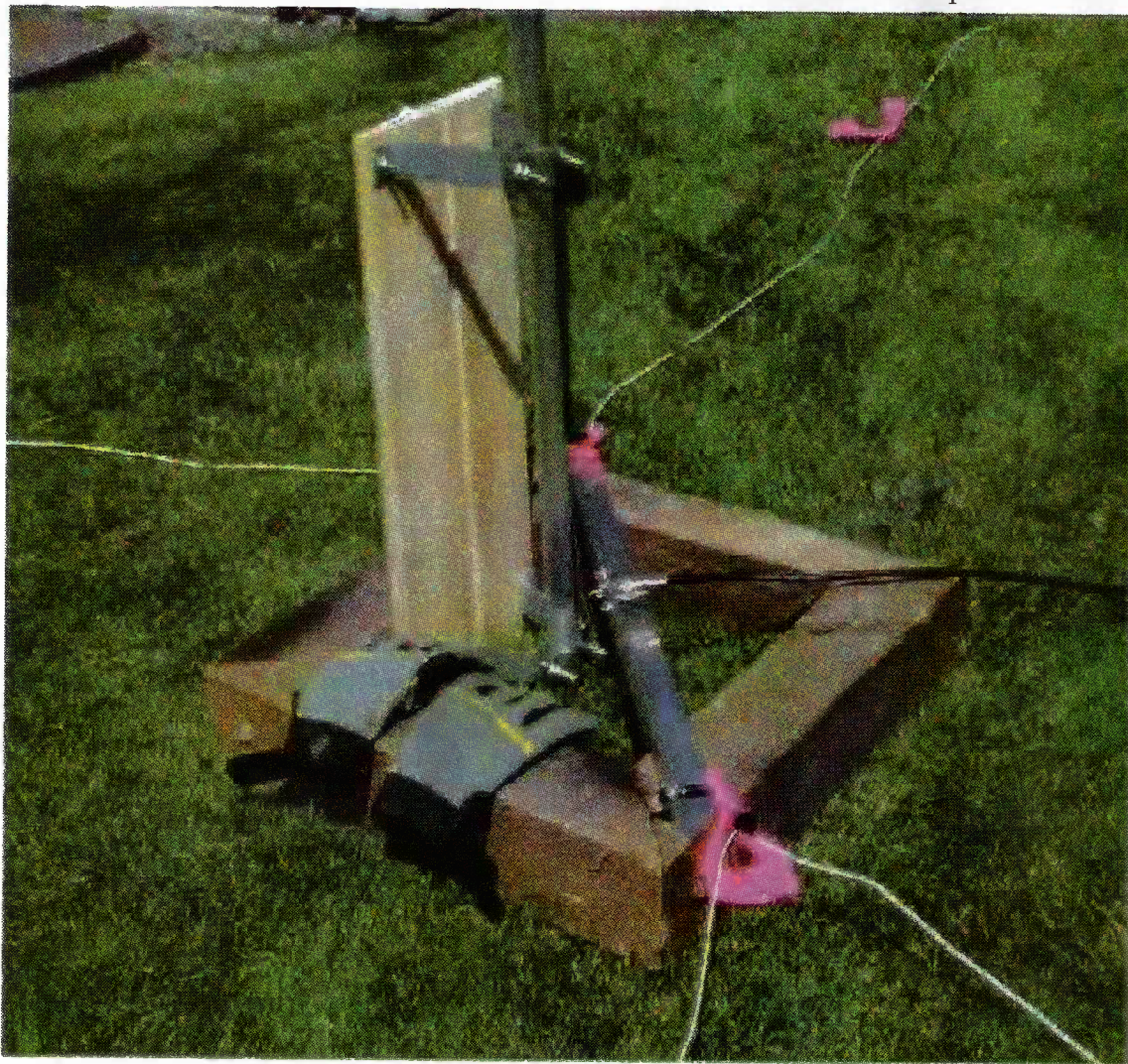

bought an extendable painter's brush handle at Ace Hardware. The painter's extension extends in two sections to almost 12 feet in length. The tubing is coated with sizing which is electrically insulating. To assure good conductivity in as an antenna, the insulation must be defeated at the top and bottom of the extension sections. At the very bottom, scrape the first two inches with sandpaper to assure contact at the clamp. At the joint between the two tubing sections, drill a hole and insert a stainless sheet metal screw for good contact.

To provide a full quarter wave, insert a 6' piece of aluminum tubing at the top, small enough to telescope inside the painter's extension. Secure the extra tubing by drilling and inserting another stainless sheet metal screw to fasten the extra piece to the painter's tubing. You should now have a conducting aluminum vertical that is 17' long or more. Make radials of any wire that is flexible and readily available. I used stranded and insulated #14 wire from Ace Hardware. Trim the radials to about 17' length to begin with and connect them in pairs to a single banana plug for insertion into the two banana jacks that have been grounded to the aluminum base brace.

Adjustment is most easily done with a variable frequency impedance bridge like the MFJ 259B. You will find that the antenna shows minimum SWR (resonance) at a frequency well below 14.0 MHz. Trim the tubing length (with a hack saw) by an inch to see how much the frequency of minimum SWR rises. Then decide how much more to cut off to move the resonance frequency half way to the desired resonance frequency (say 14.058 Mhz.) Verify the result of your cut, and then trim the same amount from all of your radials. This should bring your frequency of resonance close to the desired point. Trim further if you feel the need. Using this process my antenna shows SWR of 1.0 near 14.050 MHz.

How does this antenna work? I just finished it two weeks ago, and recently took it to the San Juan Islands in the back of the car. (The vertical section collapses to six feet, removes from the base, and fits neatly inside our Toyota Prius.) I set up up the antenna by a tidewater basin, and used the QRP radio shown in Fig. 2. Calling KH6, VE3, and W5. I worked each one in a half hour time span.



Larry's New Bug

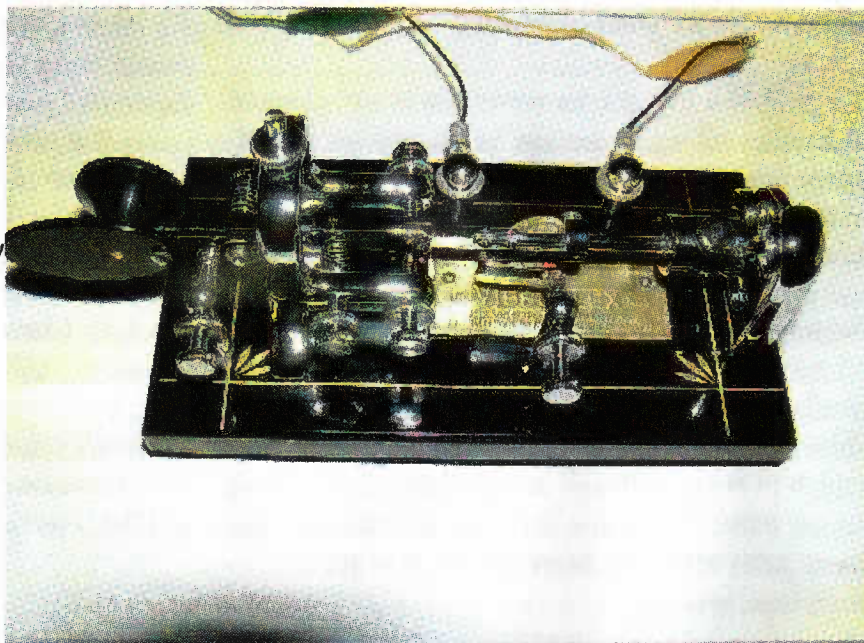
I bought a bug from vibroplex, a left handed bug by the way, and will get it on the air as soon as I practice awhile so i don't sound like a lid, ha.

My wife and I went to Edisto Beach, SC about three months ago.

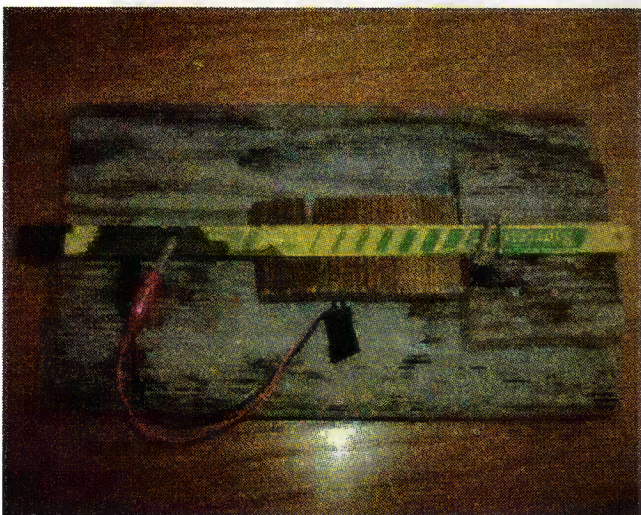
I brought my six meter radio along hoping to catch some T.E. Propagation.

A few years ago, the FCC eliminated Morse code from their amateur radio exams. They also allowed digital activity to occupy the once CW only band segments.

Morse code is legal in all bands covered by the operators' class of license, with the exception of the new 60-meter band. (see 97.305) Historically, CW operators have mostly communicated within the confines of the "CW only bands".

Presently, newer hams have no knowledge of Morse. As you know, the polite and common procedure for checking for a calm or unused frequency is to send out two or three "QRLs" followed by a question mark in Morse. "QRL?" simply means, "Is this frequency in use?"

Several times I have been engaged in an interesting conversation using Morse code. All of a sudden a wide banded, loud RTTY transmission appears directly on top of our frequency. How are we supposed to tell this RTTY operator that he/she is interfering with an on going QSO? I know the RTTY operator can hear our signals. The operator either does not care or he/she has no knowledge of Morse code. Why would the FCC allow any operator to share the CW bands without the skill of copying code? There is no way these two modes can communicate with each other. RTTY and other digital modes do not belong in the CW sub bands.

On February 14, 2009 the CW FISTS Club had its annual Winter Sprint Contest. I found it very difficult to copy or work any CW contesting stations. Radio teletype stations were ignoring our communications and they were all over the 40 and 20 meter CW segment of the bands.

It does not make any sense to mix a band full of CW operators with operators that cannot copy code. I find it very frustrating as a CW operator. I feel that we should work together and strive for CW only segments and separate digital segments on all of our bands.

Tone generators and hand made keys by kids

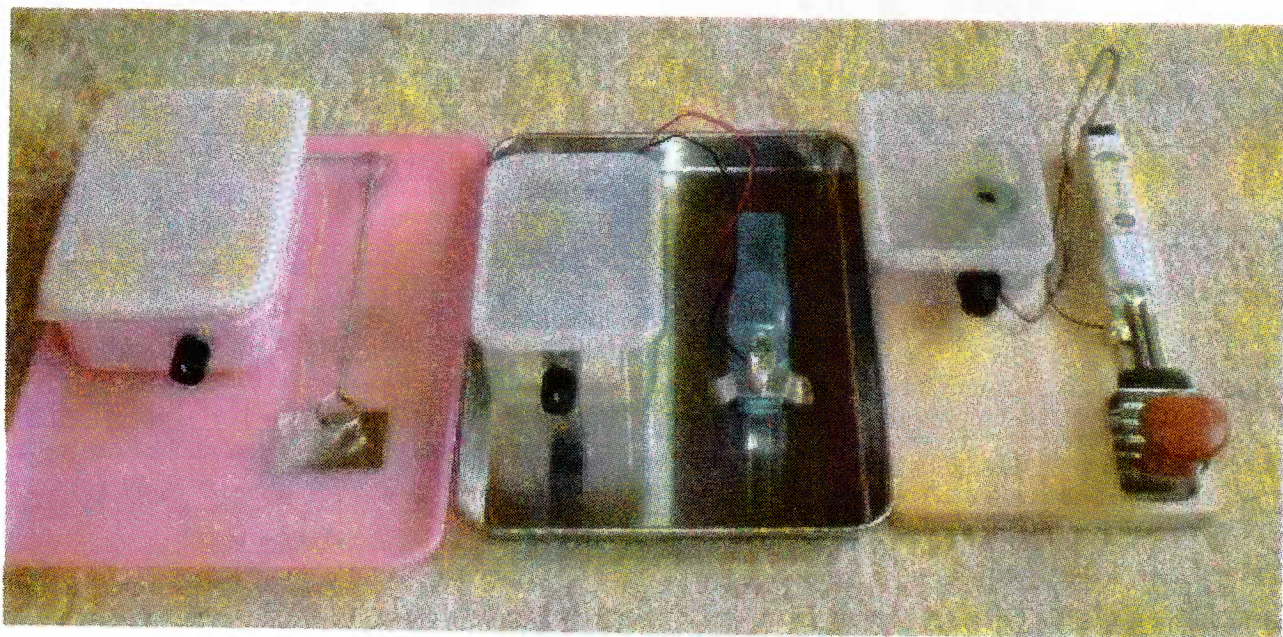

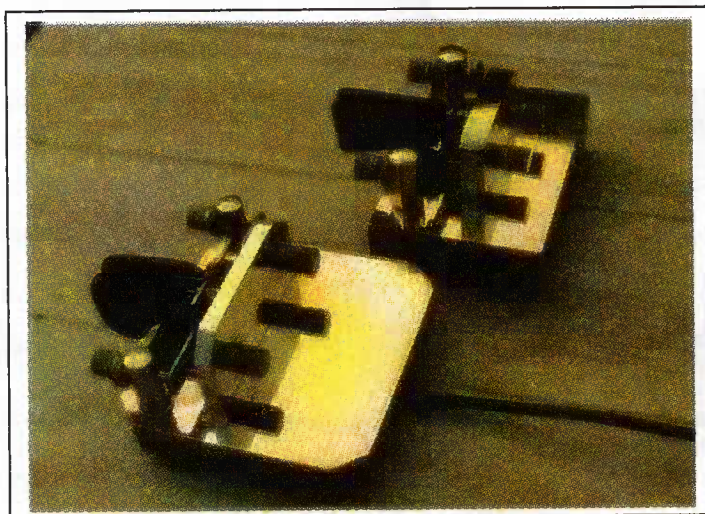
