It's also time for assessing what ham gear comes with me and what's destined to be unused for another season. Sure, an expansive shack loaded with gear makes for an impressive QSL card or QRX photo, but we all know the impracticality of shipping more than a few pieces of gear.

This year, I decided to make the culling permanent. I've decided to keep the best and give the rest to local hams and clubs. # Americas Chapter, President's Message

If you have not noticed it by now, the Bands are Open! I have a DX Cluster app for my iPhone, called "iDX Cluster." It's free. You simply touch the iDX icon and up flashes a worldwide DX-Cluster. For example, I am seeing that someone in New York State just posted a DX spot from New Zealand. It is about 5:00 p.m. EST here and I am pretty sure that the terminator or grey line is shuttling the signals to and from the other side of the world. In fact, when I looked at the grey-line map on the Internet, I saw that it ran down from New York to Antarctica and came back up, just touching Australia and running through Japan. So, the radio signals are taking a pretty long path to and from "Down Under." As the minutes go by and the line shifts to the West, you can see where the East Coast stations of the U.S. are now spotting South Korea and Japan.

The stations that are making these contacts include a lot on the CW portions of the bands and I am not talking about the FT8 stations. They certainly can make weak signal contacts, but that mode, which is computer-to-computer, is not what I was looking for. When it comes to human to human contact, CW gets through unlike any other mode.

Yesterday, I was listening to a QRP station in Utah. I could hear him breaking the static and give out his "72s" at the close of each contact.

He was at a park and was most likely using a wire thrown up in a tree or perhaps a loaded vertical of some kind. He was still getting out and making contacts.

My point is that when you mix sunspots with CW and the ability to call up a real-time grey-line map or DX Cluster on your cell phone, you have the recipe for a lot of contacts and a lot of fun. Right now, the sunspot number is around 100. That is certainly not anywhere near where it could be, but it is more than enough to allow our CW signals to reach out and touch someone across the country or across the world. All we have to do is throw up a wire, turn the radio on, and start keying.

As the cold weather closes in for many of us, we should turn off the TV and turn on the radio. Listening to and sending CW is just as much fun as you remember. There are a lot of CW stations out there. I was just listening to someone sending code at about 8 or 9 words per minute. He is having fun and I am sure that the guy working him is enjoying himself just as much.

As we go into the Holidays, we should have a few minutes to enjoy the radio. Straight Key Night is coming up on New Year's Eve and that is always great fun. I hope to hear them on the air.

### **Your OSL Accent**

Sending and receiving QSL cards is one aspect of amateur radio that has endured over the years as a fun and collectable type of activity. Sending a QSL card after having a QSO with another station was usually done as the final form of "Thank You" for an enjoyable chat on one of the amateur bands.

Most QSL cards are made the standard size of a regular postcard and have a form printed on them for reporting the particulars of a QSO. Some QSL cards now are made in larger sizes which allow more area for writing comments or notes. Keep in mind that many QSL card holders and display pages will not accept these odd size QSL cards. Larger cards may also require more postage as well.

Many operating awards use QSL cards to provide required proof of a QSO. The reporting form on the QSL card lists a number of items needed to confirm a QSO. These are: Call Sign Worked, Date, UTC Time, MODE, Frequency or Band, RST Sent. Other items can be included such as Rig, Output Power, Ant, Remarks, County, and Grid Square.

How you fill out your QSL card will determine if the card can be used for awards or not. Filling in only part of the needed information will make the card totally useless for an award. Altering a received QSL card will also make the card useless for award purposes.

The best way to not omit anything when filling out a QSL card is to follow the form on the card item for item, without fail. Then, double check all of the needed data before mailing. There is nothing more frustrating than to receive a much needed QSL card to confirm your last

state for a Worked All States award, only to discover one required piece of data was not filled in.

Always try to fill out your QSL card as accurately as possible, you never know if the other person is counting on "your" QSL to complete one of the awards they have been working a long time to complete.

I hope you will enjoy sending and collecting QSL cards as much as I have for the past 60 years.

# **SPRINT INFORMATION**

Sprints will be held eight times throughout the year on the second Saturday and third Sunday in each of the following months: Feb., May, and Aug.

#### **OBJECTIVE:**

To exchange specified information with as many FISTS members as possible using Morse Code only, and within the time frame stipulated. Sprints are a great opportunity for our newer members to get on the air, meet other club members, and have some fun! We encourage more experienced operators to please QRS to match the other operator's speed.

#### **PARTICIPANTS:**

Any properly licensed amateur radio operator, FISTS member or non-member is invited to take part in the contest. At least one of the two stations in each QSO must be a FISTS member.

#### **DATES AND TIMES:**

WINTER SATURDAY SPRINT: from 1600 UTC to 1800 UTC on second Saturday in February.
WINTER SUNDAY SPRINT: from 2100 UTC to 2300 UTC on third Sunday in February.

#### **BANDS:**

Operation is limited to the following amateur bands: 3.5, 7, 14, 21, and 28 MHz amateur bands. Look for other participants around the FISTS frequencies: 3558, 7058, 14058, 21058, and 28058 kHz. You may NOT work the same station more than once.

#### **ENTRY CLASSES:**

There are three entry classes: QRO, QRP, and Club.

- 1. **QRO**: Over 5 watts to legal limit.
- 2. QRP: 5 watts output power or less.
- 3. Club: (regardless of power).

Entry class MUST be shown on logs to be considered for entry in a particular class, or will be assumed QRO. An entry must be ONE class only, no combination of classes allowed.

#### **EXCHANGE:**

The following information must be exchanged by both stations and shown in your log for each QSO to count as a valid QSO:

FISTS members: RST, S/P/C, first name, FISTS number. Non-FISTS members: RST, S/P/C, first name. (Enter "0" Zero if your logging program requires a power entry for non-members.) S/P/C = U.S. State/Canadian Province/DXCC Country

#### **DX COUNTRY STATUS:**

U.S. states and Canadian provinces are those states and provinces that are contiguous and found within the North American continent. DX are those entities listed in the current ARRL DXCC publication, other than the above.

#### **MULTIPLIERS:**

Each U.S. state (50) and Canadian province (13) counts as 1 multiplier. Count each only once, no matter how many times worked. Each DXCC country counts as 1 multiplier. Count each only once, no matter how many times worked. Canada and the USA do not count as DX multipliers.

#### SCORING:

Each QSO with a FISTS member: 5 QSO points. Each QSO with a non-FISTS member: 2 QSO points. Final score is total QSO points times the number of multipliers worked.

#### **CERTIFICATES:**

Certificates will be awarded to the first, second, and third place finishers in each Sprint for each Entry Class. End-of-Year Certificates will be awarded ONLY to FISTS members with the highest cumulative point totals in the QRO, QRP and Club categories for all Sprints at the end of the year. Certificate will be sent to the winners via email in PDF format.

#### LOG SUBMISSIONS:

All log entries must be received within 7 days after the Sprint to be considered valid. Logs not sent to the proper address will not be considered for entry. The logs will be spot-checked for accuracy and correct scoring procedures. All logs MUST contain the following information for entry:

- Your name, call sign, mailing address, and FISTS Number if a member.
- 2. Club name and call sign if entry is for a club station.
- 3. Sprint worked—Date of the Sprint worked.
- 4. Entry class—QRO, QRP, or Club.
- 5. Number of FISTS members worked.
- 6. Number of non-FISTS worked.
- 7. FISTS number for FISTS QSOs.
- 8. List of multipliers.
- 9. Your claimed score.
